

WORKSHOP 3: SHELTER FOUNDATION

CHALLENGE

How might we activate youth in order to better engage them in long-term, specialised volunteering and how can the well-being of the actors grow together through their cooperation?

DESCRIPTION

The workshop focused on the topic of youth engagement in housing poverty and homeless care services. The case study provided by Menhely Alapvítány (Shelter Foundation) helped participants to understand the interconnected network of stakeholders in the process on a local level, analyze the current process of engagement and find ways to open up new and more efficient ways of bringing youth into housing-related volunteer work in a long-term and specialized way, creating lasting engagement and scalable peer-to-peer awareness-raising. Participants consisted of social designers, socially conscious youth, changemakers and design theorists, as well as policymakers, civil organizations and local stakeholders, and aimed to create a meaningful recommendation for the future.
