Classification Research Group held their 308<sup>th</sup> meeting on Friday 25 April, 1997. Topics of discussion included the treasurer's report, and a draft outline of chemical compounds in BC2.

IFLA, International Federation of Library Association and Institutions. Newsletter, 1(11), vol. 13,

May, 1997 for the meeting of the Round Table of Editors of Library Journals. "Towards Electronic Journals" was the general theme of the meeting, with three papers being presented. Prof. H. Chr. Hobohm presented the article "Changing the Galaxy: on the transformation of a printed library journal to an electronic one" that described the changing of the editorial process and the financial impacts of INSPWL going online. The article by Roger Brisson and Ruth Carter, entitled "Using of the World Wide Web to Complement Print Journals: the experience of Cataloging and Classification Quarterly," focuses on the issue of timeliness and the differences between print and electronic publication. And, the article by Maurice Line, entitled "The Case for Retaining Printed LIS Journals," focuses on whether journals that are produced electronically should also produce a print version. He sites reasons for retaining the printed text and the unreliability of electronic access. The Newsletter of the IFLA Round Table of the Library Journals is published twice a year.
