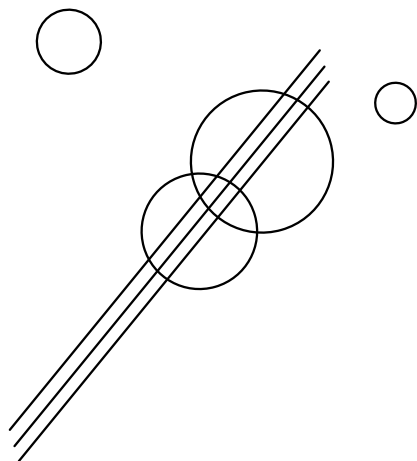


EDITOR'S NOTE
