Miglė Bareikytė is an assistant professor of digital studies at Europa-Universität Viadrina Frankfurt (Oder). She has a background in media studies, STS and political theory. Her research explores and analyses digital media and conflict, media witnessing, digital archives, attention economies, and media accountability, with a special focus on Central and Eastern Europe.

Viktoriya Sereda is a sociologist, head coordinator of the Virtual Ukraine Institute for Advanced Study (VUIAS). In 2022-23 she has been Senior Fellow at the Forum Transregionale Studien and directed the research group Prisma Ukraïna: War, Migration, Memory. Since 2020, she has also been a senior research fellow at the Institute of Ethnology of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine and a professor at the department of sociology at the Ukrainian Catholic University.
