Eine Psychiatrie ohne Zwang ist möglich – und notwendig

Dirk Richter ist sich sicher: Zwangsmaßnahmen der Psychiatrie sind mit den Menschenrechten nicht zu vereinbaren.

Auch die ethisch-rechtlichen Bedingungen für die Anwendung von Zwang können im Lichte der Forschung keinen Bestand haben. Gegen den Willen der betroffenen Person kann keine Unterbringung und keine Zwangsbehandlung legitimiert werden. Es gibt ein Recht auf Selbstbestimmung und damit auch auf Nichtbehandlung. Daraus folgende Dilemmatas im Umgang mit Selbstgefährdung, Fremdgefährdung und eingeschränkter Entscheidungsfähigkeit werden nicht wegdiskutiert, sondern mögliche Auswege skizziert.

Das Buch vermittelt streitbare Thesen gut durchdacht, wissenschaftlich fundiert und mit praktischen Ideen für eine Psychiatrie, die sich an den Bedürfnissen und Präferenzen der Menschen orientieren.

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
