

## EDITORS AND CONTRIBUTORS

*Mgr. Katarína Čavojská, PhD.*, is a sociologist and researcher specializing in the study of youth, civic life, and participation. She currently serves as an Assistant Professor at the Department of Social Work, Faculty of Education, Comenius University in Bratislava. After completing her master's degree in sociology, she pursued doctoral studies in social work. Throughout her professional career, she has gained extensive research experience working with non-governmental organizations, public administration, and academic research teams across various institutions. Her primary research interest lies in the study of youth as both a generational group and an active agent of civil society. Her research focuses on themes such as young people's needs, participation, leisure activities, and social competencies. Within this field, she has participated in several national and European research projects. As a university lecturer and researcher, she consistently bridges theoretical foundations with practical applications in teaching and research. She pays particular attention to research that informs and enhances social work practice, including supervision. From 2024 to 2025, she served as the Director of the Association of Supervisors and Social Counsellors.

*prof. PhDr. Ladislav Vaska, PhD.*, is a Professor at the Department of Social Work, Faculty of Education, Comenius University in Bratislava, where he also serves as Head of the Department and Program Director. He concurrently holds a part-time position at the Department of Social Work, Faculty of Social and Economic Studies, Jan Evangelista Purkyně University in Ústí nad Labem (Czech Republic). He is an active supervisor of social workers and students, and the principal investigator of the project Transformations of Supervision in the Context of Digitalization. He has completed long-term group psychotherapy training at a depth-oriented level and, in 2007, long-term training in supervision (at the Association of Supervisors and Social Counsellors). His professional career is primarily focused on supervision in social work – in its theoretical, research, and practical dimensions.

*Mgr. Filip Bambúch, PhD.*, has been working at the Faculty of Education, Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica, since September 2022. He graduated in social work from the Catholic University in Ružomberok. During his doctoral studies, he focused on communication elements in interactions between social workers and clients. As part of his studies, he had the opportunity to participate in various student mobility programs, educational programs and internships. These took place in Ostrava, Prague, Lublin, Warsaw, and Brussels. He regularly participates in grant projects as well as academic conferences and further professional education. He is currently a frequent participant in group psychoanalytic psychotherapy at the Institute of Applied Psychoanalysis in Opočno.

*doc. PhDr. Peter Brnula, PhD.*, is a graduate in Social Work and has completed long-term training in Person-Centered Psychotherapy according to C. R. Rogers and training in supervision. He currently works as an associate professor at the Department of Social Work at the Faculty of Education, Comenius University in Bratislava, and at the Faculty of Humanities, Charles University in Prague. He focuses on topics such as the history of social work, ethics in social work, theories of social work, and the transformation of social services. In practice, he works as a supervisor in social work and social services and is also involved in the transformation of social services into community-based social services in the Slovak Republic. His research focuses mainly on the history and theories of social work, ethics in social work, and supervision in social work.

*doc. PhDr. Alžbeta Brozmanová Gregorová, PhD.*, has been working at the Faculty of Education of Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica since 2002. She is one of the founding members of the Department of Social Work at the Faculty of Education of Matej Bel University, established in 2004. In her scientific research, teaching, and publication activities, she primarily focuses on issues of volunteering, service learning, civic engagement and the third sector, project development and management, participatory approaches, and work with youth. She has contributed to the preparation of several strategic and legislative documents in the field of volunteering. She is a Fulbright Program alumna, having participated in the program at Eastern Michigan University in the United States in 2021.

*doc. PhDr. Martina Hrozenská, PhD.*, works as an associate professor at the Department of Social Work, Faculty of Education, Comenius University in Bratislava. Her professional focus includes methods and forms of social work, social services, gender-based violence, work with older adults, and persons with disabilities. She is a guest member of the Slovak Chamber of Social Workers and Social Work Assistants and a member of the Association of Social Work Educators. She participates in scientific grant projects (APVV, VEGA, KEGA) and several national projects in the social field as a principal investigator, co-investigator, or expert guarantor. She serves as Secretary of the Field Committee for the study program Social Work at the Faculty of Education, Comenius University in Bratislava. She supervises theses at all levels of higher education in the field of social work and serves on committees for state final examinations, rigorous and doctoral procedures, and habilitation. She regularly publishes in national and international scientific and professional journals.

*prof. PhDr. Eva Mydlíková, PhD.*, works at the Department of Social Work at Trnava University in Trnava and serves as Vice-Rector for Scientific, Artistic and Publishing Activities at the same institution. She also professionally guarantees a supervision course for helping professions in Brno. Together with Professor Ján Gabura and Professor Milan Schavel, she contributed to the founding of the Association of Supervisors and Social Counsellors and co-created the first supervision training courses in Slovakia, where she worked for many years as a lecturer. For many years, she has provided supervision for non-governmental organizations in the social field, as well as for professionals working in the social and legal protection of children and social guardianship at offices of labor, social affairs, and family.

*PhDr. Erik Šatara, PhD.*, works as an Assistant Professor and serves as Head of the Department of Social Work at the Faculty of Education, Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica. He specializes in social work with older adults and marginalized groups and previously worked as a field social worker. His academic interests focus on marginalized Roma communities, particularly in the context of labor mobility, an area in which he has direct professional experience that has significantly shaped his research orientation. His research addresses labor mobility, field social work, and social services for older adults, including the use of information and communication technologies in elderly care. He currently focuses on the social aspects of informal caregiving, especially the combination of paid work and informal caregiving for older adults in Slovakia, a topic that is increasingly relevant in the context of population ageing and the sustainability of the long-term care system. In his teaching, he emphasizes the integration of theory and practice and prepares students to respond effectively to the needs of diverse target groups. In addition to teaching and research, he actively cooperates with organizations providing social services.

*doc. PhDr. Michaela Šavrnichová, PhD.*, works at the Department of Social Work, Faculty of Education, Comenius University in Bratislava. Her scientific and research focus is on social work in the context of addictions, especially families with an addicted member, the issue of codependency, resocialization, and the function of sociotherapeutic clubs in the support system. She teaches courses focused on social work with addictions, social and legal protection and social guardianship, social work with families, prevention of risky social phenomena, sociotherapy, and resocialization. She is the chair of the Association of Educators in Social Work and a member of the editorial board of the journal *Czech and Slovak Social Work*.

*PhDr. Jana Budoš Vrtlová, PhD.*, works as a research scholar at the Department of Social Work, Faculty of Education, Comenius University in Bratislava. Her professional focus includes supervision in social work, the historical contexts and theories of social work, and social work ethics. She is a co-investigator of scientific grant projects (VEGA) and a member of the Association of Social Work Educators. She actively publishes in domestic and international scientific journals.

*Shorena Sadzaglishvili, MSW, PhD.*, is Professor of Social Work at Ilia State University, Georgia. She holds an MSW from Columbia University (USA). She is a co-founder of the Georgian Association of Social Workers and the founder of the first Master's Program in Social Work in Georgia. Her work focuses on social work education, practice learning, ethics, and capacity building. She has authored numerous academic articles, training manuals, and teaching resources that have contributed to the development of the social work profession in Georgia.

*Rusudan Asatiani, MSW, PhD candidate*, is a doctoral student in social work at Ilia State University and the former Director of the Georgian Association of Social Workers (GASW). As a certified Master Trainer, she leads various international social work initiatives and organizes, delivers, and coordinates diverse training programs for social workers.
