Editorial

Today, religious landscapes are in constant transformation due to migration movements and globalisation processes. In Europe and globally, communities of faith are going through the most varied pluralisation processes. Once rather homogeneous traditions become more differentiated, interreligious exchanges and conflict relations are reshaped.

This book series confronts such processes of change on local and transnational levels and examines changing theological concepts and religious practices in different contexts of migration. It addresses such transformations by foregrounding the agency of religious actors to open up new social contexts and to move within them in a way that is productive for religion and theology.

The series is edited by Andrea Bieler and Andreas Heuser.

Andrea Bieler (Dr.) is a professor of practical theology at Universität Basel in Switzerland. She was the principal investigator of the SNSF-project *Conviviality in Motion. Exploring Theologies and Practices of Super-diverse Christian Communities in Europe*. Her research interests imply the development of a critical, empirically grounded theology and theory of conviviality. Furthermore, she does research on various phenomena of vulnerability.

Claudia Hoffmann (Dr. theol.) is lecturer in the Department of Intercultural Theology at the Faculty of Theology at Universität Basel in Switzerland. She also serves as the coordinator for religious affairs at Kanton Basel-Stadt. She was a postdoctoral researcher in the SNSF-project *Conviviality in Motion*. Her research interests cover hermeneutics of the stranger, Southeast Asian history of religion and mission, religion and migration.

Lisa Ketges was a doctoral student in the SNSF research project *Conviviality in Motion* at the Faculty of Theology at Universität Basel. She is interested in the diversity of theologies, church and society, poimenics, and religious education.
