

5. Excerpts from a photo documentation

In July-August 2022, the research team from the Institute of Sociology at Justus Liebig University (Gießen/Germany) travelled to Addis Ababa, the capital of Ethiopia, and to Hawassa (about 350 kilometres south of the capital), together with the experienced and renowned photographer Pietro Sutura (Frankfurt am Main, Germany). The photographer was given permission to access factories in Bole Lemi Industrial Park (Addis Ababa) and Hawassa Industrial Park (Hawassa), allowing for a unique documentation of working in a textile factory in Ethiopia. Photos show the industrial parks, and factory sheds, and portray workers in their working and living environment. Together with the interviews, the pictures of women working in the industrial parks in Addis Ababa and Hawassa allow for a detailed, nuanced, and unique insight into the work and life of the predominantly female Ethiopian textile and garment operators. They also document the evolvement of new forms of working and living in Ethiopia's urban centres. The following pictures show a selection of the extensive material collected.
