Zhyldyz Bakirova is deputy director of the Republican Center of Narcology in Bishkek and PhD student at the International School of Medicine of the International University of Kyrgyzstan. She is trained as a psychiatrist/narcologist, and participated in a number of international research projects, including the Central Asia Drug Action Programme (CADAP) and in the study “Needs and gaps in treatment and rehabilitation for people who use drugs in selected countries of EECA.” Zhyldyz is an expert of the national group of developers of the UNODC quality assurance tools. She has published articles on opioid overdose and the drug rehabilitation in the Kyrgyz Republic. Her research interests include social work in the treatment continuum and organization of psychosocial assistance to persons with substance dependence in Kyrgyzstan.

Tynchtyk Estebes Uulu is a PhD student at the Department of Sociology of Bishkek State University. He holds a master's degree from the OSCE Academy in Bishkek, majoring in “Politics and Security” with a special focus on Central Asia. His current major research focuses on social work, NGOs, the probation system, drug addiction, drug trafficking and sustainable development.

Simon Fleißner is research assistant at the Institute for Addiction Research at the University of Applied Sciences in Frankfurt am Main. He holds a MA in Research in Social Work and is currently working as a project coordinator in the Germany-wide model project NALtrain on the implementation of take-home naloxone in addiction aid in Germany. At the same time, he is investigating the processes of implementation of take-home naloxone in Germany in his doctoral thesis. He is also focusing on the topic of women in prison from a human rights perspective in a global context.

Medet Kudabekov is a PhD student at the Department of Sociology and Social Work of the Eurasian National University named after L.N. Gumilyov in Astana, Kazakhstan. His main research interests include professionalization of social work in the framework of modernization of the social service system.

Ingo Ilja Michels, PhD, is sociologist and advisor for treatment of drug dependence. Since 2010, he was Project Leader of the EU Central Asia Drug Action Programme (CADAP), since 2020 he is the International Scientific Coordinator of the DAAD project “Social work and strengthening NGOs in development cooperation to treat drug addiction”(SOLID) of the Frankfurt University of Applied Sciences. He worked in psychiatric clinic with drug dependent heroin user, as Head of the Drugs and Prison projects department of the German AIDS-Hilfe in Berlin, as Drug Commissioner of the Federal State of Bremen in northern Germany, and as Head of the Office of the Federal Drug Commissioner within the Federal Ministry of Health in Berlin. He is freelance advisor for drug services in PR China in Beijing and Shanghai and Guest Professor at the Department of Sociology/Social Work of the East China University of Science and Technology (ECUST), Shanghai. He is author of several articles on prevention and

treatment of drug dependents and on drug policy in International Journals on Substance Use.

Dalida Mukasheva is PhD student at the Department of Sociology and Social work of the Eurasian National University, named after L. Gumilyov. Her main research topic include health and social welfare in prisons, the situation of women with HIV and the professional roles of social workers. Before joining the SOLID Project, Dalida worked for development agencies in Kazakhstan. She has experience in education, science and research, and is member of the National Alliance of Professional Social Workers of Kazakhstan.

Nurgul Musaeva, PhD, is Associate Professor of Psychology at the Bishkek State University (BSU) named after K. Karasayev. She holds a PhD in Social Philosophy. She is member of the Association of Social Workers of the Kyrgyz Republic and one of the developers of the State Educational Standards in the direction of "Social Work" and "Psychology" at Master's and Bachelor's level. Since 2020, she is National Scientific Coordinator of the SOLID Exceed SOLID project Kyrgyzstan, which is funded by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). She is the author of more than 30 scientific articles, three books devoted to the philosophy of social work, the development of psychological thoughts among the Kyrgyz people and social psychology. Currently, she is studying the issues of training specialists to work with vulnerable population groups such as people living with HIV, prisoners and people using drugs.

Cholpon Omurkanova is director of the Public Foundation "Egl". From April 2011 to June 2021, she was chairwoman of the public Council of the state penitentiary Service of the Kyrgyz Republic. She is an independent expert on the reform of the penitentiary system. Moreover, she is a mediator and expert on conflict transformation. Mrs. Omurkanova participated in several monitoring studies of the penitentiary system of the Kyrgyz Republic.

Eric Orozaliev, PhD, is a professor of psychology at the K. Karasayev BSU and dean of the Faculty of Social Psychology. At the same time, he is a member of the council for the defense of candidate and doctoral disserta-

tions in sociology and political science at the J. Balasagyn KNU, president of the Association of Social Workers of the Kyrgyz Republic and chairman of the public supervisory board of the Ministry of Social Development of the Kyrgyz Republic. Professor Orozaliev has published more than 80 scientific articles and methodological works, including 6 monographs and textbooks for practicing social workers and psychologists. He was awarded as excellent employee of the education system of the Kyrgyz Republic and as honored scientist of the Kyrgyz Republic.

Ulla Pape, PhD, is a postdoc in the SOLID Project (Germany) and scientific staff member at the Institute of Addiction Research of the University of Applied Sciences in Frankfurt am Main. She holds a Ph.D. in International Relations and International Organization from the University of Groningen. Before joining the SOLID project in 2022, Ulla was research associate at Free University Berlin, University of Bremen, Radboud University Nijmegen, and Higher School of Economics in Moscow. Her research interests include international health and social policy, welfare state development and civil society in Eastern Europe and Central Asia. Ulla has published a book *The Politics of HIV/Aids in Russia* (2014) and several articles in international journals such as *Europe-Asia Studies*, the *Journal of Civil Society*, the *International Journal for Sociology and Social Policy*, and *Voluntas*. In the SOLID project, Ulla is responsible for the research on social work in the prisons and social work and infectious diseases (HIV, HCV and tuberculosis). Furthermore, she focuses on the participation with civil society actors in developing social work in Central Asia. In addition, Ulla is member of the editorial board of *Voluntas* and associate lecturer at the Free University Berlin.

Mariya Prilutskaya, PhD, is a postdoc at the SOLID Project (Kazakhstan) and a research assistant at Semey Medical University (Pavlodar, Kazakhstan). She graduated from Astana Medical University in 2008 and has worked as a psychiatrist for ten years. The sphere of her professional interests is drug addiction. In the last seven years, she has focused on the problems of novel psychoactive substances in clinical practice of Kazakhstani doctors. Mariya Prilutskaya studies the epidemiological and clinical aspects of drug addictions caused by synthetic cannabinoids and cathinones in Kazakhstan. and Documentation Centre for Drug Literature and Research at the Frankfurt University of Applied Sciences (<http://www.archido.info/>), and the “Institute of Addiction Research of the University of Applied Sciences in Frankfurt” (<https://bit.ly/3GV0XFC>). Main fields of his research and project development expertise are health promotion for vulnerable groups, drug services, prisons, and related health issues (especially HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis C, and drug dependence). Consultant for the European Commission, United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), WHO, European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction (EMCDDA), International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), and Open Society Institute (OSI) in various contexts. He has published several articles in international journals and books on preventing and treating infectious diseases adequately (HIV/AIDS, hepatitis, STIs, and TB), opioid substitution programs, and drug treatment in general.

Hang Su, PhD, is a postdoc at the Shanghai Mental Health Center, majoring in psychiatry and mental health. Hang Su has been engaged in the basic and clinical research of drug dependence and substance addiction, and learn knowledge about addiction medicine, psychology, epidemiology and sociology since 2011.
