### **Tonio Friedmann**

### **Lela Mélon**

Dr. Lela Mélon is an expert in EU corporate law and sustainability, recognized for her academic and consultancy work at the intersection of law, policy, and sustainable business. With a background in law and economics, she has held prestigious roles including Marie Curie Research Fellow at Pompeu Fabra University and recipient of the 2021 Emerging Sustainability Leader Award.
