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Ulrich Müller holds a PhD in geography and specialises in development policies and governance. He joined the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ, then GTZ) in 1997 and currently works as Senior Advisor in the Methods, Digital Transformation and Innovation Division, where he focuses on networks, knowledge sharing, triangular cooperation, emerging countries cooperation agencies and development funds. For over 30 years, he has worked with and in Latin America, particularly in Colombia, Argentina, Paraguay, Bolivia, Brazil and Mexico. He also co-edited a series of academic books on development topics such as ownership and political steering, triangular cooperation and global funds and networks.
