UDC at IFLA

A half-day UDC Workshop organized by the IFLA Standing Committee on Classification and Indexing and co-sponsored by UDC, FID and the British Standards Institution (BSI) was held at the 64th IFLA Conference in Amsterdam, August 19, 1998. Approximately 50 persons attended the session chaired by Professor I.C. **McIlwaine**, Editor in Chief of UDC. Four papers were presented. The purpose of the workshop was to provide attendees with an up-to-date view of the current state of UDC, an indication of future revision plans, a demonstration of certain UDC products and an opportunity for people to address questions to a panel of speakers.
