Main Theme: Knowledge Organization for a sustainable world: challenges and perspectives for cultural, scientific, and technological sharing in a connected society

Objectives:

- to identify different perspectives of scientific dialog in the international environment of knowledge organization

3. The social and political dimension of knowledge organization (education and professional practice in KO, ethics in KO, culture and identity in KO, and KO for a sustainable development).
