Knowledge organization (KO) education and training have been carried out in diverse scientific fields, including traditional library and information science education. New disciplinary practices are rising, and the potential boundaries of KO are getting wider.

This special issue aims to explore different perspectives and approaches in KO education. It aims to cover teaching and learning practices in formal education, professional development and training.

This special issue welcomes conceptual, theoretical, and empirical submissions to explore the multiple education perspectives for KO worldwide.

Potential topics include, but are not limited to:

- Education for subject analysis
- Education for KO in specialized fields (e.g., Medicine)
- Education for the development of Knowledge Organization Systems
- Education for development and use of metadata, ontologies, and taxonomies
